KS1 Milestone 1  Year 1 Basic  Year 2 Advancing/ Deep	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Respond to ideas and starting points.</li><li>Explore ideas and collect visual information.</li><li>Explore different methods and materials as ideas develop.</li></ul>	<p><u>Paint</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Use thick and thin brushes.</li><li>Mix primary colours to make secondary colours.</li><li>Add white to colours to make tints and black to make tones.</li><li>Create colour wheels using primary and secondary colours.</li></ul> <p><u>Sculpture</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Use a combination of shapes.</li><li>Include line and texture.</li><li>Use materials such as natural objects to create pattern, line and shape.</li></ul> <p><u>Textiles</u></p>	<p><u>Collage</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Use a combination of materials that are cut, torn and glued.</li><li>Sort and arrange materials.</li><li>Mix materials to create texture.</li></ul> <p><u>Print</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Use repeating or overlapping shapes.</li><li>Mimic prints from the environment and/or those of artists studied.</li><li>Use objects to create prints (e.g. fruit, sponges)</li><li>Press, roll, rub and stamp to make prints.</li></ul> <p><u>Drawing</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Draw lines of different lines and thicknesses.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Describe the work of notable artists, artisans and designers.</li><li>Use some of the ideas of artist studied to create pieces.</li></ul>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use plaiting and twisting to create cords.</li> <li>Use (paper) weaving to create patterns.</li> <li>Join materials using glue and/or a stitch.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Colour (own work) neatly, following the lines.</li> <li>Show pattern and texture by adding dots and lines.</li> </ul>	
LKS2 Milestone 2		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Collect information, sketches and resources.</li> <li>Adapt and refine ideas as they progress.</li> <li>Explore ideas in a variety of ways.</li> <li>Comment on artworks using visual language.</li> </ul>	<p><u>Paint</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use a number of brush techniques using thick and thin brushes to produce shapes, textures, patterns and lines.</li> <li>Mix colours effectively.</li> <li>Use watercolour paints to produce washes for backgrounds then add detail.</li> <li>Experiment with creating mood with colour.</li> </ul> <p><u>Sculpture</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Create and combine shapes to create recognisable forms that convey feeling, expression or movement.</li> <li>Use clay and other mouldable materials.</li> </ul> <p><u>Textiles</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Create weavings.</li> <li>Thread a large eyed needle.</li> <li>Shape and stitch materials.</li> </ul>	<p><u>Collage</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Select and arrange materials for a striking effect.</li> <li>Ensure work is precise.</li> <li>Use coiling, overlapping, tessellation, mosaic and montage.</li> </ul> <p><u>Print</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use layers of two or more colours.</li> <li>Replicate patterns in natural or built environments.</li> <li>Make printing blocks (e.g. from coiled string glued to a block).</li> <li>Make precise repeating patterns.</li> </ul> <p><u>Drawing</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use different hardnesses of pencil to show line, tone and texture.</li> <li>Sketch lightly (no need to use a rubber to correct mistakes).</li> <li>Use shading to show light and shadow.</li> <li>Use hatching and cross hatching to show tone and texture.</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Replicate some of the techniques used by notable artists, artisans and designers.</li> <li>Create original pieces that are influenced by studies of others.</li> </ul>
UKS2 Milestone 3		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Collect information, sketches and resources and present ideas imaginatively in a sketchbook.</li> </ul>	<p><u>Paint</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sketch (lightly) before painting to combine line and colour.</li> <li>Create a colour palette based upon colours observed in the natural or built world.</li> <li>Use the qualities of watercolour to create visually interesting pieces.</li> </ul>	<p><u>Collage</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Mix textures (rough and smooth, plain and patterned).</li> <li>Combine visual and tactile qualities.</li> </ul> <p><u>Print</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Build up layers of colour.</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Give details (including own sketches) about the style of some notable artists, artisans and designers.</li> </ul>

<b>Year 5 Basic</b>  <b>Year 6 Advancing/ Deep</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use the qualities of materials to enhance ideas.</li> <li>Spot the potential in unexpected results as work progresses.</li> <li>Comment on artwork with a fluent grasp of visual language.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Combine colour tone and tints to enhance the mood of a piece.</li> <li>Use brush techniques and the qualities of paint to create texture.</li> <li>Develop a personal style of painting, based on ideas from other artists.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Sculpture</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Show lifelike qualities and real-life proportions or, if abstract, provoke different interpretations.</li> <li>Use tools to carve and add shape, texture and pattern.</li> <li>Combine visual and tactile qualities.</li> <li>Use frameworks to provide stability and form.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Textiles</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Show precision in techniques.</li> <li>Choose from a range of stitching techniques.</li> <li>Combine previously learnt techniques to create pieces.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Create an accurate pattern, showing fine detail.</li> <li>Use a range of visual elements to reflect the purpose of the work.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Drawing</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use a variety of techniques to add interesting effects (e.g. reflections, shadows, direction of light)</li> <li>Use a choice of techniques to depict movement, perspective, shadows and reflection).</li> <li>Choose a style of drawing suitable for the work (e.g. realistic or impressionistic).</li> <li>Use lines to represent movement.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Show how the work of those studied was influential in society and to other artists.</li> <li>Create original pieces that show a range of influences and styles</li> </ul>
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
